

Gujarat: Goons on rampage stab, thrash nine in two hours



RAJKOT: Goons unleashed terror on Morbi Road on Diwali night as they went on a stabbing and looting spree, attacking at least nine people at four separate locations within two hours.

Police arrested Devsi Koli, Karan Mer and Arjun Mer, but before they had assaulted the victims who were immersed in festivities. Four separate offences were lodged against them. Senior police officials said that the three resorted to terrorizing people merely to establish their supremacy in the area. Moving around in a car, they first attacked two migrant labourers living in the rooms of a school in Satellite Chowk locality without rhyme or reason at around 10pm. They were armed with knives, sticks, pipes and other sharp weapons. A 52-year-old security man, Vallabh Raiyan, who tried to intervene, was also thrashed. They even picked up the chairs in the classroom and flung them at the three and then thrashed them with sticks. Raiyan lodged a complaint with B-district police station.

Thereafter, the trio went to a firecracker stall in the locality and stabbed two people including a lab technician Arjun Lathiya and his younger brother Rahul, who were severely injured. The brother had come to buy crackers.

All the injured were rushed to the civil hospital in the 108 emergency ambulance.

The assailants did not stop after attacking these five people. They drove to Jay Janay-Way Kisan Society at around 11pm and picked up a

quarrel with Vinod Karena who was running a firecracker stall. They asked him why he had opened the stall without their permission and started thrashing Vinod and his partner Paresh Boricha. They even looted crackers worth Rs 3,000.

Then, they targeted another cracker stall and thrashed Hardik Chandra and his brother Piyush in the same area and looted crackers worth Rs 18,000.

Police teams fanned out in the area and nabbed them. They were booked under several IPC sections including attempt to murder and rioting. Four separate offences were lodged against them. Senior police officials said that the three resorted to terrorizing people merely to establish their supremacy in the area.

Sunil and Arpita knew each other during a course of sanitary inspector in 2018 and after an affair, they got married on September 24 that year in a temple as their families were not agreeing to the relationship. Later, the families accepted their relationship and got them married as per social custom on October 15. Meanwhile, the couple developed differences and on November 24, Sunil sent Arpita to her parents' home. Arpita, who was pregnant, gave birth to a baby girl in February 2021. But her separation from Sunil continued. Meanwhile, Arpita filed cases with police and in court through her lawyer Ashvin Jagodiyani. Sunil too approached court through his lawyer Hiral Panwala. 

1,032 Hindus from Pakistan to vote for first time as Indians in Ahmedabad

More than a thousand Pakistani Hindu refugees who are now Indian citizens will vote for the first time in the upcoming assembly election. In all, 1,032 such refugees, who were awarded Indian citizenship by the Ahmedabad collector in the past five years, will have a say in electing the new state government. Since 2016, Ahmedabad collector's office has given Indian citizenship to 1,032 Hindus from neighbouring Pakistan. They were forced to take refuge in India after being persecuted in their own country as members of minority communities. According to the 2016 and 2018 gazettes, the offices of Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar and Bhuj collectors have the authority to award Indian citizenship documents to Hindus, Sikhs, Christians and Parsis from Pakistan, Afghanistan and Bangladesh after approval from central and state intelligence agencies. On August 22, state home minister Harsh Sanghavi had handed over the certificates of Indian citizenship to 40 Hindu refugees from Pakistan at Ahmedabad collector's office. One of these new Indian citizens who will cast their mandate for the first time is Dilip Maheshwari, 36, who was born in Mithi town of Tharparkar in Pakistan. Maheshwari was one of the 212 Pakistani Hindu refugees who were given Indian citizenship in 2021. His wife Mayra received her citizenship this year. Maheshwari says that he had been trying to get Indian citizenship since 1995. "I visited India on a short-term tourist visa in 2008 for the first time. I was here on a pilgrimage. I have been trying to get a long-term visa since 1995. In 2008, I got the visa and when it expired, I returned to Pakistan. In 2013, I got a long-term visa and have been in Gujarat since," Maheshwari told TOL. "At the time of partition, a few of my extended family members had emigrated to India but my family could not. I had made up my mind about becoming an Indian citizen," added Maheshwari, who studied in a Sindhi medium school in Mithi. He said that he has voted many times in the elections in Pakistan. "There you must stamp a ballot paper. My wife and I are quite excited to vote for the first time here and elect the new government in Gujarat," Maheshwari said.

"Four arrested with MD worth 59L in Sachin



Surat: City police's special operation group (SOG) seized 590 gram of mephedrone worth Rs 59 lakh from four people at Kapletha checkpost in Sachin.

They peddlers had sold the contraband from Mumbai to be sold in the city.

Those arrested were Azharuddin alias Kela Shalki (27), Rizwan alias Smarti Shaikh (25), Tauthid Arif Shaikh (22) and Imroj Idrish Shaikh (27). They are residents of different areas of the city.

Police stopped their car for checking and seized the drugs, the four-wheeler car and seven mobile phones.

"We keep a close tab on illegal activities of drug peddling and strict action will be taken against those involved," said city police commissioner Ajay Tomar.

Investigation revealed that the four were hoping for a brisk business during the festive season but they did not get enough contraband. Hence, they decided to purchase it from Mumbai and distribute it to the group of local sellers.

Police are collecting details of those who sold drugs to the four and those who were going to buy it from them. "We have arrested 200 people involved in drug trafficking in the past two years and found that they did not have a past record of such crime. It shows that as police are taking stringent actions against the regular offenders, new people are entering this illegal trade," said Tomar.

PM Modi to virtually attend 'bhoomi pujan' of ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel's Hazira plant expansion



AHMEDABAD: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will on Friday virtually attend the 'bhoomi pujan' of the expansion project of steel major ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel India's flagship plant at Hazira in Gujarat's Surat district, officials said.

The company was early this month awarded an environmental clearance to expand the capacity at its plant in Hazira from the current crude steel capacity of

9 million tonnes per annum (MTPA) to 15 MTPA.

Union Steel Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia will also virtually attend the ground breaking ceremony that will take place at 2 pm. Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel will visit the plant for the event along with Member of Parliament from Navsari C R Paati.

"This increased steel manufacturing capacity represents a significant boost for the government's National Steel Policy, which envisages doubling domestic capacity to 300 MTPA by 2030 in a growing economy, as well as for AMNS India's own long-term plans to expand capacity," the company said.
